

Board Briefs

Regular Board Meeting

During Open Forum, Lewis Dorrity of Building a Better Government expressed his concerns regarding District 50's capital projects.

Superintendent Johnson reported the district raised more than \$23,000 dollars for the Haiti Relief Effort.

Chad Evans, principal of Brewer Middle School, introduced Brewer's faculty and staff. Two eighth graders, Lucy Stevens and Daja Norman, spoke of their experiences at the school. A power point slideshow highlighted the teachers, students, parents, and staff of Brewer.

Superintendent Johnson announced the State of the District Address will be held Tuesday, February 23rd at the Genesis Education Center at 6 pm. The event will be open to everyone.

Assistant Superintendent Pat Ross gave a brief summary of results from the 2009 PASS, Palmetto Assessment of State Standards, administered last school year.

Assistant Superintendent Gerald Witt gave an overview of the emergency procedures manual revisions.

Assistant Superintendent Gary Johnson gave a financial update on the FY10 budget. He also noted that there will be cuts in every area of the district's budget next year. A first draft budget for next year will be developed in March.

Southern Management representative Forrest King presented the monthly update on the district's capital building campaign.

In action items, the Board approved prioritizing bond funded capital projects.

The Board approved a bond resolution to authorize bond sales for next year.

The Board approved personnel recommendations.

Brad Nickles was named principal of Emerald High School.
